Pathways Health Centre for Children is a family-centred community agency serving children and youth with physical, developmental and communication needs and their families as well as adults for selected specialized services in Lambton County. The Centre provides a full range of pediatric rehabilitation and support services. Aquatic programs in our therapeutic pool are open to people of all ages and abilities in the community. There is also an integrated childcare service (C.A.C.H.É.) on site. Our vision of supporting children, youth and young adults to achieve their potential through effective partnerships aren't just words, we live it every day at Pathways.

Resource Consultant – Full-time Permanent

Under the direction of the Supervisor of Community Services, the Resource Consultant will provide special needs resource support to children birth to 12 years of age. The Resource Consultant promotes and supports inclusion of children in licensed child care facilities including Before and After School programs and licensed home child care settings within the County of Lambton.

The Resource Consultant will provide orientation, direct support and guidance to Resource Assistants and Support Facilitators in implementing the Care Plan working in partnership with child care educators.

QUALIFICATIONS, KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:

- Early Childhood Education (ECE) Diploma or equivalent
- Specialized diploma or certificate - Autism Behavioural Science Diploma, Resource Teacher Consultant Certificate, Early Intervention Certificate preferred
- Registered and in good standing with the College of Early Childhood Education or registration as applicable in a professional discipline association
- Minimum 2 years of experience in ECE work essential
- Experience and knowledge working with children with special needs in licensed childcare/school an asset
- Experience supporting children with autism and their families is an asset
- Must have a good knowledge of child development, child care best practices, family dynamics, inclusive early learning, early childhood/special needs programming, and the Child Care and Early Years Act, 2014 (CCEY) and the Child and Family Services Act (CFSA), Province of Ontario.
- Cultural Competency training is an asset
- Fluency in French is an asset

The successful candidate must have a valid Ontario driver's license and maintain adequate liability insurance or must have ongoing access to a vehicle and driver for Pathways business. A Vulnerable Sector Police Check is also required at time of hire (dated within the last 6 months).
