Soon, I will go to Pathways.



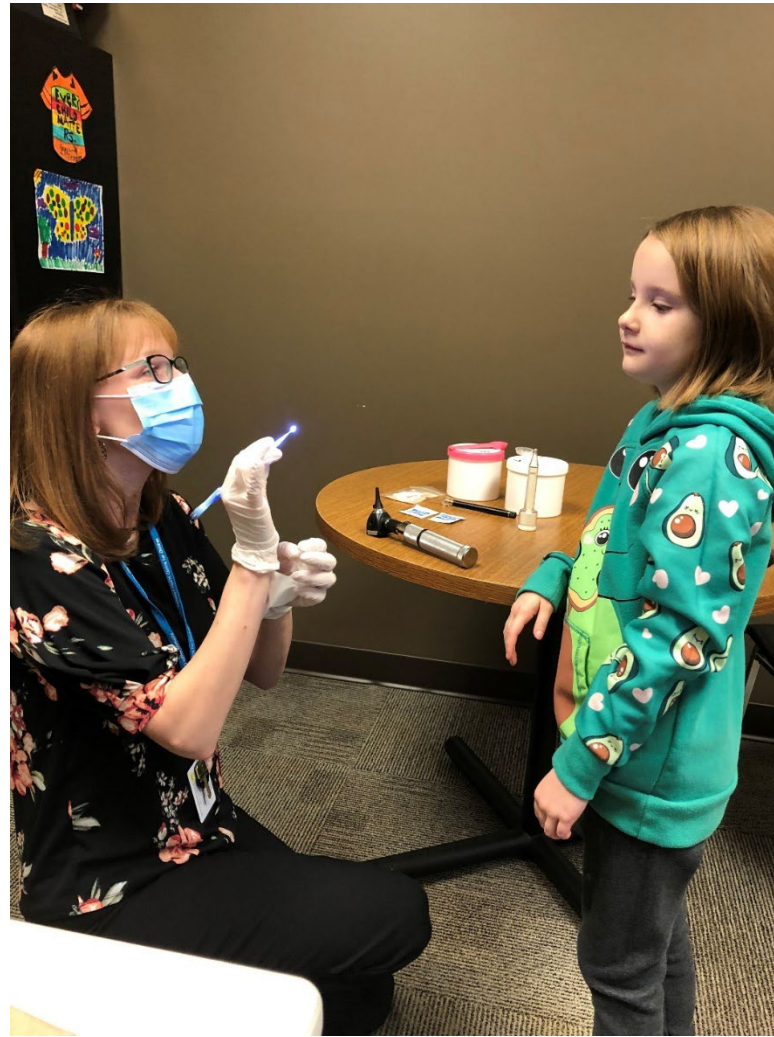
Jenny will meet with me to take a mold of my ears!



These are the tools that will be used. It's actually pretty fun!



First, she will check my ear to make sure that it looks healthy and that I do not have a lot of wax.



If I do have some wax, she will carefully remove it with a scoop that has a light on it. This will not hurt – but it might tickle!



I need to be still like a statue while she does this!



She will check to make sure the wax is no longer in my ear.



Then, she will put a small cotton ball in my ear to make sure that my eardrum is protected. Again, this will not hurt. My ear will just feel a bit full.



Next, she will take a little bit of the pink and white stuff...



And mix it together in her hands



This will be placed inside a little plastic tube.



Jenny will hold the tube to my ear and slowly put the material in. Don't worry – it's not a needle! It's just the mixture of the pink and white stuff!



It will take a few minutes to harden in in my ear. It looks pretty cool!



When it does harden, she will take it out gently by tugging on my ear first and then slowly pulling the mold out of my ear.



Now I can see what the shape of my ear is like! The cotton comes out at the same time.



She will check my ear once more to make sure it is all clean.
