Speech-Language Pathologist (Part-time Permanent)

Under the general direction of a Supervisor of Clinical Services, and in partnership with the Clinical Services team, the Speech Language Pathologist will provide service to clients of Pathways Health Centre for Children, through School Based Rehabilitation Services, with the local Indigenous communities at Bkejwanong Walpole Island, and other programs needing Speech-Language support. This could include but may not be limited to screenings, assessments, intervention supports, consultation, swallowing and feeding screenings, augmentative communications and counseling and education to families, primary caregivers, schools and the community.
